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Executive Summary

In 2013, CAGC put forth a New Issue Proposal on the use of registries. Registries are used by clients as part of their contractor management program to pre-qualify service providers. The advent of the use of registries by clients is relatively a new development in contractor management within the upstream oil and gas industry. Clients require their service providers to have accounts with their registry providers and submit their Health and Safety Programs to the registry provider to pre-qualify for work. The use of registries for contractor management results in costs and efforts for both the client and the contractor. In response, a survey was proposed to better understand the challenges.

The survey was conducted using Survey Monkey and was opened on November 9, 2014 and closed on February 6, 2015. The survey questions were developed in consultation with all six industry associations. The survey link was sent to all six associations for distribution to their members. This survey data is not validated, but is taken "as is" and should be viewed with this perspective. A total of 93 respondents provided survey data. The findings of the survey have been grouped into four sections: profile, resources, validation and perception. Highlights include the following:

Profile:

- The majority of contractors are required to submit to multiple (2-5) registries.
- Clients are managing between 10 and 2,500 contractors with one or more registries.
- The vast majority of clients and contractors use ISNetworld and COMPLYWORKS.

Resources:

- The survey highlights the resource demands of registries both in terms of personnel and other related costs.
- The overall cost and effort of registry participation will be felt much more by smaller contractors than larger contractors.

Verification:

- Most clients are using validation methods beyond documentation review.
- Contractors are subject to multiple verification exercises including an average of three health and safety audits per year.
- There are divergent perspectives on COR/SECOR.
- Clients treat COR/SECOR as part of an overall score, but not required. Contractors believe that it is always required.

Perception:

- Contractors have significant concerns regarding the privacy of their information in registries.
- Clients have no privacy concerns in relation to Canadian privacy regulations.
- A large majority of contractors did not feel that the data submitted to registries accurately reflects their Health and Safety program.



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1.0 Introduction

In 2013, CAGC put forth a New Issue Proposal on the use of registries. Registries are used by clients as part of their contractor management program to pre-qualify service providers. The advent of the use of registries by clients is relatively a new development in contractor management within the upstream oil and gas industry. Clients require their service providers to have accounts with their registry providers and submit their Health and Safety Programs to the registry provider to pre-qualify for work. The use of registries for contractor management results in costs and efforts for both the client and the contractor. In response, a survey was proposed to better understand the challenges.

2.0 Methodology

The survey was conducted using Survey Monkey and was opened on November 9, 2014 and closed on February 6, 2015. The survey questions were developed in consultation with all six industry associations. The survey link was sent to all six associations for distribution to their members. The survey categorized respondents into three categories: Client, Contractor or Both. The survey consisted of up to 54 questions depending on which category respondents fell into. For a complete list of the questions please refer to Appendix I.

3.0 Limitations

It is important to recognize that not all respondents answered all of the questions. Some questions were intentionally omitted and in some cases respondents indicated that they used registries to manage contractors as well as qualify for contracts, but did not fill out both survey questions. This survey data is not validated, but is taken "as is" and should be viewed with this perspective.

4.0 Summary of Results

A total of 93 respondents provided survey data. The results of the survey are grouped into the four sections: profile, resources, validation and perception. For all of the tabulated and graphed results please refer to Appendix II.


4.1 Profile

- The majority of contractors are required to submit to multiple (2-5) registries.
- Clients are managing between 10 and 2,500 contractors with one or more registries. (Graph 6 in Appendix II).
- The vast majority of clients and contractors use ISNetworld and COMPLYWORKS.



4.3 Verification

- Most clients are using validation methods beyond documentation review. (Table 12 in Appendix II)
- Contractors are subject to multiple verification exercises including an average of three health and safety audits per year.
- There are divergent perspectives on COR/SECOR. (Graph 17 and 18 in Appendix II)
- Clients treat COR/SECOR as part of an overall score, but not required. Contractors believe that it is always required.

(Question: How many of the following types of contractor verification/audit activities are you subject to in a typical year? Open field)






- Contracts have significant concerns regarding the privacy of their information in registries.






(Question: Approximately what percentage of your company's overall business operations is subject to registry participation? Open field)


Graph 3 - Registries identified by contractors as required for their business as a percentage of total responses



(Question: Approximatly how many contractors do you monitor in Canada with your current registry provider(s)? Open field)






Graph 7 - Estimated number of personnel dedicated to registry management by contractors

Graph 8 - Estimated number of personnel dedicated to registry management by clients





Graph 11 - Total registry costs for clients, licensing fees and data management costs



Graph 12 - Contract value and average total registry costs across all contract value categories









Graph 14 - Contractors understanding of how client evaluates their data

Graph 16 - Average number of each verification type per year by contractors as compared to contract value





Graph 17 - Contractor response – percentage of clients that require a COR/SECOR



Graph 18 - Clients response to role of COR/SECOR



Graph 19 - Contractor's concern over registry privacy




Graph 20 - Client response to registry privacy

(Question: Do you gather contractor information that is subject to privacy regulations in Canada?)




Graph 21 - Contractor's response on how accurately the registry data reflects their health and safety programs
