Journey management





What is journey management?

Journey management: process to eliminate or minimize exposure to driving-related hazards

- 1. Avoid unnecessary travel, driving
- 2. When driving is necessary, know and manage the associated risks




Hierarchy of controls

MOST

Effective Reliable Sustainable

HIERARCHY OF CONTROLS



Avoid unnecessary travel

The **no-travel** alternatives – hazard elimination

- telephone, email, virtual meetings, video conferencing
- CCTV, drones, remote sensing, etc.









What's the best way to get there?

- Plane
- Bus or taxi
- Ride share
- Walk or cycle





If driving is necessary, minimize exposure to hazards

- Identify hazards and assess risks.
- Determine measures to avoid or minimize exposure.
- **Build** those measures into trip plan.



Annual risk assessments

Annual risk assessment

- Identify driving hazards employees face
- Determine which ones pose greatest risks
- Set priorities
- Implement measures





Manage day-to-day risks

- Think about the trip ahead.
- What hazards will you encounter?
- How will you deal with them?
- Use information to build trip plan that minimizes exposure to those hazards.

Mind on driving


AUDITORY



Ears tuned to environment



Have a distracted driving policy



Set a good example

- Hands-on role in building and implementing
- Lead by example
- Communicate
 - Tailgate meetings
 - Walk-arounds
 - Ride-alongs
 - Newsletter, emails





What else can you do?

- Remove built-in distractions
- Fix dangerous, inconsistent expectations
- Choose vehicles with user-friendly systems
- Learn how your system works
- Make adjustments before driving
- Let your co-pilot help
- Pull over





Pre-hire driving evaluations





Practical benefits

- Driving skills part of expected competencies
- Best way to observe skills and behaviours
- Cost-effective
- Helps you make good hiring decisions
- Bring in people with safe driving performance



Legal requirements

Motor Vehicle Act – must not hire a person to drive unless they have a valid and appropriate class of driver's licence

Occupational Health and Safety Regulation – employee must not drive for work unless they demonstrate competency, know operating instructions

Pre-hire evaluations:

- a way to address legal requirements, due diligence
- match employee driving assignments with abilities
- understand what training is necessary for employee to develop the driving skills they need



Build driving skills into job description

Know what driving skills employees need for work

Include competencies in hiring process

- Class of licence(s)
- Driving record
- Certifications
- Specific experience loads, people, vehicles,


